

League of Women Voters of the South Bend Area Annual Report - June 4, 2019

Introduction

The Bylaws of the League of Women Voters of the South Bend Area provide that the program shall consist of (a) action to protect the right to vote of every citizen, and (b) those local government issues chosen for concerted study and action.

For 2018-2019, at its 2018 Annual Business Meeting, the membership voted to retain all current LWV South Bend Area positions, proposed no local studies, and adopted a local program focus on issues and principles related to Making Democracy Work, in congruence with the current programs of LWV United States and LWV Indiana, including:

- Redistricting Reform
- Voting Rights & Voter Protection
- Voter/Civic Education
- "Good Government"

In support of its adopted program and goals set by its Board of Directors, the League carried out a dynamic program of education, advocacy, voter engagement, and community support. This report summarizes the League's activities for the period for the League's fiscal year July 2018 – June 2019.

Board Development

The Board is finishing its second year of operations utilizing a leadership structure created to more evenly distribute responsibility at the board level. The current structure is comprised of a Secretary, a Treasurer, six elected Directors, plus Directors of Voter Registration, Voter Services and Education, and Administration, who oversee the work of an effective set of committees with both on- and off-board chairs. The structure is working well, and the Board continues to refine and improve its processes.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

LWV South Bend Area has embraced the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion (DEI) policy adopted by LWV United States at its 2018 convention. The policy:

LWV is an organization fully committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion in principle and in practice. Diversity, equity, and inclusion are central to the organization's current and future success in engaging all individuals, households, communities, and policy makers in creating a more perfect democracy.

There shall be no barriers to full participation in this organization on the basis of gender, gender identity, ethnicity, race, native or indigenous origin, age, generation, sexual orientation, culture, religion, belief system, marital status, parental status, socioeconomic status, language, accent, ability status, mental health, educational level or background, geography, nationality, work style, work experience, job role function, thinking style, personality type, physical appearance, political perspective or affiliation and/or any other characteristic that can be identified as recognizing or illustrating diversity.

Moving the policy to action, LWV South Bend Area has:

- Waived membership fees for students through January 2021 in order to make membership accessible for students. Since LWVUS and LWV Indiana have also waived the per-member-payment (PMP) for students during this period, students incur no membership cost during this period.
- Engaged in training offered by board member Terri Russ.
- Created a poll to gauge interest in a reading and discussion group with a focus on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

Vote411.org Voter Guide

The League again published online voter guides for both the Fall 2018 General Election and the 2019 South Bend Municipal Primary Election, partnering with the American Democracy Project and the *South Bend Tribune*. The voter guide posed questions to all candidates in both elections. Statistics:

Voter Registration

Since 2012 the League has registered 5853 new voters in schools, community events, and Naturalization ceremonies through May 2019.

School Voter Registration Program

From July 2018 through May 2019, the League registered 57 new voters at 6 events at these four schools: Adams High School, South Bend Career Academy, Excel Center, and Ivy Tech. Please note, any registrations completed during the last month of this fiscal year, June 2019, are not yet available for inclusion in this report.

Naturalization Ceremony Voter Registration Program

From July 2018 through May 2019, the League registered 446 new voters at 11 ceremonies, including 64 new voters at a special naturalization ceremony held at the University of Notre Dame on April 4, 2019. Please note, an additional ceremony is scheduled for June 2019.

Community Voter Registration Events

At 25 community events, the League registered 94 new voters and often provided information on public policy issues such as redistricting reform. Additional events for next year are already on the schedule.

At these events, the voter registration team also served as League ambassadors, providing opportunities for organizational networking and for community members to learn more about the work of the League.

Redistricting Reform Education and Advocacy

LWV South Bend Area continued its work to educate the public and advocate for redistricting reform with these activities:

- League member Lisa Plencner spoke at Temple Beth-el August 19
- Julia Vaughn of All-IN for Democracy spoke at Lunch with the League September 14
- Supported the work of the Indiana Coalition for Redistricting Reform (All-IN for Democracy) by issuing action alerts and encouraging participation in redistricting rallies

Unfortunately, all significant reform bills introduced in the Indiana General Assembly failed. The Coalition plans to introduce legislation in the 2020 session and also to engage in public education and advocacy related to the next 10-year redistricting process.

Friend-Raiser and Making Democracy Work Award

At this well-attended community event, the League recognized Nanci Flores with the 2018 Making Democracy Work Award for her work at La Casa de Amistad. Pianist Del'Shawn Taylor provided entertainment. The event was held October 24 at First Unitarian Church of South Bend. The event raised substantial funds through a silent auction and donations.
